1. Make friends with other students. How?

- Request a Mentor from the <u>ISEE Peer Mentor Program!</u> ISEE matches current
 DePaul students with new incoming international students and helps students adjust
 to DePaul student life.
- <u>Join a Student Organization!</u> DePaul University has over 300 Student Clubs and Organizations. Many of them are active virtually.
- Attend a <u>Bon Appetit Lunch</u>, a social meeting to explore cuisines from around the world and eat together either in Chicago restaurants or in Zoom.
- Attend the <u>Global Coffee Hour</u>, a program that orients first-year graduate and undergraduate international students to student life at DePaul and in Chicago.

2. Get to Know Chicago:

- Read about Chicago Neighborhoods
- Quiz yourself on Chicago <u>Trivia</u>
- Explore Chicago <u>History</u>

3. Live healthy! How?

- Get enough sleep each night.
- Eat nutritional food and avoid junk food.
- Go out and exercise see DePaul's Campus Recreation team for ideas!
- Talk to someone if you need help!
