In the Management Information Systems (MIS) program, you'll learn both the business and technological foundations of information systems management. DePaul's undergraduate MIS degree program will prepare you to pursue a variety of careers requiring both business and technological skills.

What skills do students develop in this program?

Students acquire a broad understanding of information technologies and the information systems life cycle and apply this to business processes; gain the ability to identify organizational data; design and manipulate databases; and integrate technical knowledge with an understanding of business operations.
