# Lincoln Park Campus Check-In Location

Now that you have determined your move-in date, listed below is where you will go for your check-in. In an effort to reduce congestion, when moving in on a weekend date (August 26 or September 1), you should use the following time slots.

- Students living in *even-numbered units* should arrive between 9 a.m. and noon.
- ° Students living in *odd-numbered units* should arrive between 1 p.m. and 4 p.m.

# CONNECT WITH YOUR ROOMMATES

You can find your roommate or roommates listed in Housing Connection at myhousing.depaul.edu. If your assigned roommate chooses not to come to DePaul, another will be assigned to the vacant space. We encourage you to check the portal periodically during the summer in case of updates.

Have an open mind when speaking with your roommates and recognize that this is new territory for all. **Roommates cannot be changed prior to move-in day.** 

When you talk with your roommate(s), you should discuss how you'll decorate your unit. In addition, be sure you don't have duplicates of the below items, as only a single of each is allowed per unit.

- Mini-fridge\* must be 4.8 cubic feet or less (not allowed in apartments)
- Microwave must be 900 watts or less.
- TV

\*If you're living in a traditional residence hall, you may rent a micro-fridge from MyCollegeFridge.com, the approved DePaul vendor.

- Confirm with all of your roommates before renting.
- Rental items will be delivered to your room prior to move-in day if ordered by the August 9 deadline.

# **MEAL PLANS**

All campus residents are required to have a meal plan. If you have any dietary restrictions or allergies, please email Housing Services at housing@depaul.edu. Keep in mind that the meal plan requirements do not permit release based on religious dictates, personal food choice, lifestyle or preferences (e.g., vegetarian, vegan), or other non-medically based dietary requirements.

Below are details about how meal plans work, and more information is available at go.depaul.edu/mealplans:

- Meal allotments: Plans provide a set number of meal allotments per quarter, which vary depending on the plan type and are for personal use only. Unused meal allotments do not roll over from quarter to quarter.
- Flex dollars: Flex dollars can be used for purchases outside of the main dining areas (such as campus cafes) and when classes are not in session (such as spring break). Flex dollars are made available on the first day of each quarter and do roll over from quarter to quarter, but not from year to year. Any Flex dollars remaining at the end of spring quarter will be forfeited.
- Using plans: Meal plan account information is encoded directly onto your DePaul ID Card. Simply present your DePaul ID to the cashier and enjoy all-you-care-to-eat dining.
- Changing plans: No meal plan changes are accepted after the end of the second week of classes. To change a meal plan, submit the Meal Plan Change Request form at go.depaul.edu/mealplanform.

# SUGGESTED PACKING LIST

As you plan for move-in day, please note that there are items you should bring and ones you cannot bring. Any prohibited items found in campus housing will be confiscated by staff. See the full list of restricted and prohibited items at go.depaul.edu/prohibiteditems.

### THINGS TO MAKE YOU FEEL AT HOME:

- Pillow, blankets, mattress pad/ encasement; beds are twin XL except in McCabe Hall and Centennial Hall (regular twin)
- · Earplugs/eye mask
- Clothes hangers
- Poster putty or 3M hooks or strips
- · Room decorations and photos
- · Towels and washcloths
- · Shower caddy and toiletries
- · Cleaning supplies

- Laundry detergent (highefficiency liquid or detergent pods preferred over powdered detergent)
- · First aid kit
- Desk lamp (preferably with LED or CFL bulb)
- Dishes, cutlery and kitchen storage containers
- Fan
- · Small vacuum cleaner

### THINGS TO LEAVE AT HOME:

- Candles, scented oil burners and incense
- Extension cords (non-surgeprotected), outlet adapters and outlet splitters
- Halogen lamps, lava lamps and strobe lights
- Electric blankets, space heaters and portable air-conditioners
- Toaster ovens, convection ovens, outgood grills and deep fryers
- · Flammable liquids
- Pets

- Appliances that use more than 900 watts or that have exposed heating elements
- Weapons (including firearms, swords and blades, stun guns and Tasers, pepper spray or mace)
- Self-propelled movement devices, including hoverboards and Segway scooters (excludes approved wheelchairs or devices)

### KITCHEN USE ONLY:

These items are allowed in residence halls but can only be used in kitchens. They must be unplugged when not in use.

- · Hot plates and electric burners
- · Rice cookers and slow cookers
- Indoor grilling appliances (George Foreman Grills, electric skillets)
- Popcorn poppers
- Sandwich makers and panini presses
- Toasters
- Irons (may also be used in laundry rooms)

# MOVE-IN DAY INSTRUCTIONS

### 1. ARRIVE AT YOUR CHECK-IN STATION

- If your move-in date is August 22 or August 28, check in directly at the Student Center. If your move-in date is August 26 or September 1, check in directly at your residence hall (see addresses below and map on back cover).
- If you do not have your DePaul ID Card, please visit ID Services.
- Pull your vehicle into a designated unloading zone for your building. There is no parking available for trailers on university property.

### 2. RECEIVE YOUR KEYS

- Bring your DePaul ID Card to check in with staff inside the building.
- · You (the resident) will pick up your keys and parking/guest wristbands.

### 3. UNLOAD YOUR CAR QUICKLY

- After checking in and receiving your keys, immediately start unloading your belongings at the curb. There is a 15-minute time limit for unloading your car in the unloading zone.
- Housing staff will be available to offer light moving assistance on August 26 and September 1.
- If possible, we recommend that you bring your own dolly to make the move easier.

### 4. PARK CAR IN DESIGNATED AREA

- · Move your vehicle to a designated area by following directions given by staff.
- Please remember not to park in handicapped spaces, fire lanes, service areas, driving lanes or other areas not designated for parking.
- You will receive a parking wristband during check-in that will allow you to park in designated parking lots/garages free of charge during designated hours on the following move-in dates: August 22, August 26, August 28 and September 1.

Centennial Hall: 2345 North Sheffield Avenue. Go to the third floor of Centennial Hall,

which is off of the fourth level of the Sheffield parking garage.

Clifton-Fullerton Hall: 2350 North Clifton Avenue

Corcoran Hall: Turn from Fullerton Avenue onto Fremont Street to unload at the back

of the building. Directional signage will be posted during move-in day.

Courtside Apartments: Check in at Sheffield Square (see address below).

McCabe Hall: 900 West Belden Avenue Munroe Hall: 2312 North Clifton Avenue

Sanctuary Hall and Townhomes: There are two locations based on unit numbers.

2345 North Kenmore Avenue for: Sanctuary Hall 115-120, Townhomes 1-17

Seton Hall: 2425 North Sheffield Avenue
