Major choices of off-campus housing



- Apartments owned by companies
 - Standard contracts
 - Leasing office
- Apartments and Townhouse owned by private owners
 - Maintenance (Who fix? Who pay?)
 - Contracts (see next page)









Contracts

- Rent
- Deposit
- Payment methods
- Due date
- Utilities (gas, water, electricity and internet)
- Move-in / move out date and fees
- Extra documents may be required

- Short tenancy: several months
- Furnished room
- Must see the contract or inform landlord to make sure he/she has this right.

Getting on the CTA

Get from the university:

-U-Pass (add money during breaks)

Keep adding money:

- -Ventra card
- -Temporary ventra pass







Costs of Pass

1-Day CTA Pass for \$10


3-Day CTA Pass for \$20

7-Day CTA Pass for \$28

7-Day CTA/Pace Pass* for \$33


30-Day CTA/Pace Pass* for \$100

Buy these at the vending machines and you may only reload ventra cards and the U-Pass.



Buses

- -Track the bus by texting CTABUS and the number next to it to 41411.
- -The owl on the sign tells you the bus runs overnight.
- -Tells you what time of the day the bus runs
- -Displays the route it takes



Buses

- -The front of the bus will tell you where it is going. It will also have the number.
- -Number 66 Chicago
- -Pull the cord to request a stop



Trains

- -Look at the front, side, and color of the sign.
- -It maybe the red line but it may be headed south (95th) not north (Howard)
- -Signs above tell you the arrival time of the train
- -Read the stairs to see if the train stops there. You may need to get on the other side.



Trains

Purple: Linden to Loop

Red:95th to Howard

Brown: Kimball to Loop


Orange: Midway to Loop

Green: Cottage Grove to Harlem

Blue:O'Hare to Forest Park

Pink:54th/Cermak to Loop

Yellow: Dempster/Skokie to Howard


