

Meet Me at the Mission: 2021 Vincentian Heritage Scholarship

4-Credit Hour Course Scholarship

Description:

During the 2020-2021 school year, there will be no Vincentian Heritage Tour to Paris. We hope to find a new way for students to engage in the mission and continue to deepen their Vincentian leadership skills. This year only, we will offer the **Meet Me at the Mission: Vincentian Heritage Scholarship** to students who want to take either a Vincentian Studies or Peace, Justice and Conflict Studies class during Winter or Spring Quarter.

This scholarship is a way to honor students who continue to study and engage with our Vincentian heritage while also embodying the Vincentian tenet of "We form each other." Being in community is more crucial now than ever and we want to provide a meaningful experience for those in this program. Through a cohort-experience, this scholarship offers students space to react and reflect on the world around us by combining academic experiences with community gatherings with peers. During these community gatherings, students will have the invitation to work within - to form ourselves - in response to what is happening in the world. As part of this cohort, students will create a community of care and connection to go deeper into our Vincentian mission together.

The scholarship is available to students who want to take one of the approved courses (see below) during Winter or Spring Quarter. It is a one-time, non-renewable scholarship for the cost of one 4-credit hour course. It will be applied directly to your tuition for the class. For example, if you choose to take the Life and Times of Vincent de Paul during Winter 2021, the scholarship would cover this class.

To apply for this scholarship, you must meet the following criteria:

- Currently enrolled DePaul Freshman/Soph/Jr/Sr
- Completed 1 Meet Me at the Mission Pillar
- Willingness to participate in cohort experience which includes attending two meetings during Winter and one during spring quarter with other scholarship recipients
- Demonstrated leadership experience, preferably at DePaul
- Complete the Meet at the Mission: 2021 Vincentian Heritage application on <u>DeHub</u> by **January 6, 2021** at **Noon**

Expectations:

- Engage meaningfully and intentionally with course materials
- Attend scholarship community-based events
- Complete a <u>Seeds of the Mission</u> story
- Be an active participant in Vinny Squad to assist in at least 1 student leadership mission trainings or host a virtual event with a team
- Commit to on-going promotion of the Meet Me at the Mission events through social media and personal invitation.

Outcomes:

- Earn 2 Meet Me at the Mission pillars
- Deepen knowledge of Vincentian heritage
- Develop social justice and systemic change tools to respond to current signs of the times
- Reflect on your role as a Vincentian leader
- Put Vincentian leadership skills into action by sharing the knowledge learned with a wider audience
- Receive priority in the application process when traditional Vincentian Heritage Tours are relaunched.
- If CTH courses are selected, complete your religious domain requirement
