OVERVIEW

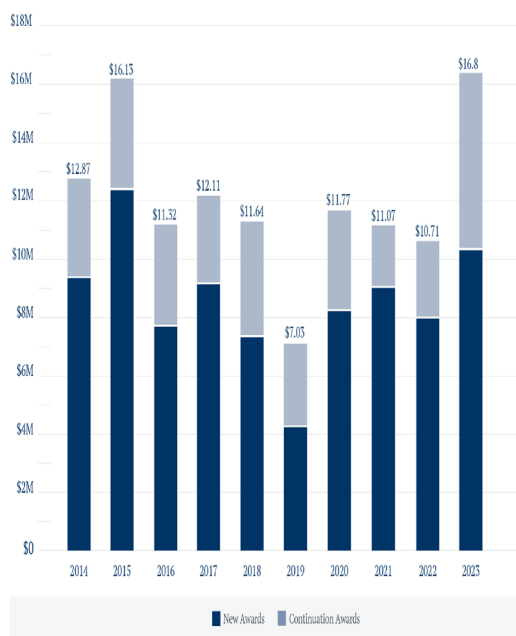


Figure 1: Sponsored Project Funding FY 2014-23

One hallmark of a thriving academic institution is the vitality of its research culture. Over the last ten years, DePaul University has received over \$121.4M in sponsored project funding. The latest metrics demonstrate our research enterprise continues its gradual recovery from the COVID-19 pandemic. In FY 2023 DePaul University requested funding totaling \$71.1 million and received a record high of \$16.8 million in new and continuation grants (Figure 1). Seventy-nine distinct sponsors supported the University's research and creative activities this fiscal year.

A research culture is not measured, however, solely by the quantitative metric of grants awarded, or

revenues generated; rather, it is typified by the pervasiveness of innovative ideas, the stimulation of dialogue, and the commitment to advancing knowledge. As a scholarly community, faculty and staff at DePaul exemplify such a culture. Scholarship and creative endeavors not only advance disciplinary, interdisciplinary and professional knowledge but also provide a foundation for the enrichment of teaching and instruction at the University.

DePaul University's annual Innovation Day celebrated this institutional culture and the power of creative collaborations. Themed "Breaking Barriers through Creative Collaboration", [Innovation Day 2023](#) was inspired by the belief that innovation is often born out of [unexpected partnerships and approaches to solving problems](#).

A strong culture of collaboration is also integral to the University's research enterprise. In FY 2023 a new inter-institutional collaborative [research grant program](#) between DePaul University and Rosalind Franklin University of Medicine and Science was launched. The program leverages two fast moving trends nationally and locally- Artificial Intelligence (AI) and Biomedical Discovery and Healthcare. Such collaborations not only provide a gateway for our faculty to connect with colleagues at a peer institution to catalyze research and scholarship activity, but also foster extramurally-funded research collaborations and stimulate technology transfer and commercialization arising from said collaborations. In its inaugural year, the grant program has funded [three projects](#) to kickstart research among interdisciplinary teams, which include biologists, computer scientists, a geographer and a physicist.

The Office of Research Services (ORS) also served faculty and staff in FY 2023 by offering a variety of programs designed to enhance the research culture and infrastructure of the University. Activities included full-day programming that allowed participants to delve deep into a specialized topic such as sessions on preparation of federal proposals to the National Science Foundation and National Institutes of Health as well as short sessions and classroom lectures on mastery of foundational concepts, processes or procedures such as locating funding, grant proposal budgeting, data sharing, submission of requisitions, understanding internal grant initiatives, and research protections. ORS also continued its Lunch & Learn Series hosting three sessions integral to building our faculty's collaborative research prowess: Strategies to Support Convergent Research, Leveraging our Partnership with the Illinois Science & Technology Coalition (ISTC) and DePaul, and the aforementioned RFUMS Collaboration for AI in Biomedical Discovery and Healthcare.

The culture of research and scholarship emanates from the collective commitment and accomplishments of the entire University community. We are delighted to present the *FY 2023 Sponsored Research and Creative Activities Annual Report*, which reflects another year of commitment and accomplishment of our faculty and staff.

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SECTION I: EXTRAMURAL SUBMISSIONS

The Extramural Submissions section summarizes the activities of the Pre-Award Services unit of ORS. The Pre-Award staff assists faculty and staff with identifying funding sources, preparing and submitting proposals, requests for data agreements, material transfer and nondisclosure agreements, and/or other information as may be necessary to secure project funding and/or liaise with extramural funding agencies. For direct foundation and corporate submissions, these activities are done in concert with DePaul's Advancement Office. The number of submissions and the level of funding requested are the metrics used to understand Pre-Award Services' level of activity. These two metrics, therefore, are incorporated into the various figures and tables that are used to report on pre-award activities within Section I.

SUBMISSION TRENDS

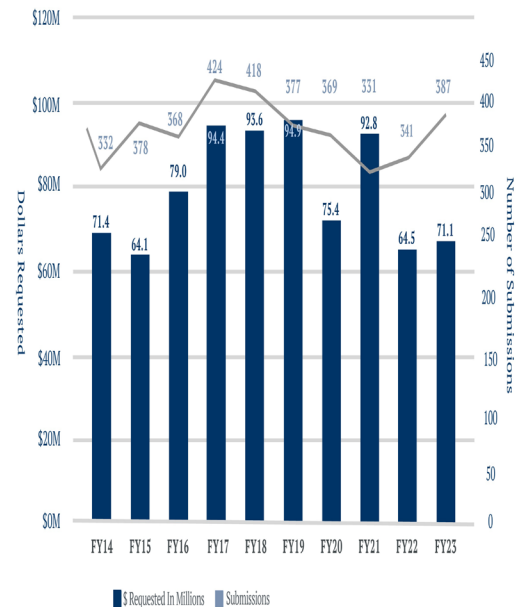


Figure 1.1: Submissions/Funds Requested, FY 2014-2023

In fiscal year (FY) 2023, ORS' Pre-Award Services unit supported 387 submissions (258 with monetary activity), to 115 distinct agencies. FY 2023 requested funding totaled \$71,137,007. Trends in sponsored program submission activity for the 2014 to 2023 FY period are detailed in Table 1.1 and illustrated in Figure 1.1. The number of FY 2023 submissions increased 13.5%

performance slightly exceeds DePaul's typical institutional performance that has consistently ranged from 330 to 380 submissions per year in seven of the past ten fiscal years. Funds solicited in FY 2023 totaled \$71.1M, up 10.2% over the \$64.6M requested in FY 2022.

Looking retrospectively over the past decade, the number of FY 2023 submissions represent a 16.5% increase over those requested in FY 2014, while the total dollar value of submissions in FY 2023 as compared to FY 2014 was relatively stagnant. It is pertinent to point out that DePaul's sponsored program submission activity is largely driven by a small group of grants-active faculty that submit multiple submissions, rather than evenly distributed across a broad spectrum of faculty scholars.

Also noteworthy, is both that not all submissions request funds, and that for any given FY, there is not necessarily a direct relationship between the number of submissions and the number of awards received. An action on a proposal submission in one FY may not occur until a subsequent FY. For example, submissions to federal agencies typically require a six- to nine-month review period; hence, submissions for the last half of the 2023 FY, may not generate awards until the 2024 FY. Noteworthy too, because the scope of this report is limited to extramural and intramural grant activities, it does not report on all important projects undertaken by our faculty without grant support.

SUBMISSIONS BY PURPOSE

FY 2024 submission activity, classified by

proposed purpose, is detailed in Table 1.2.

Consistent with DePaul's performance in prior fiscal years submission activity is principally for external support of faculty and staff research activities.

PUBLIC vs. PRIVATE SUBMISSIONS

In FY 2023, 39% of submissions on behalf of the University were to public funding sources including federal, state and municipal agencies; 61% of

submissions were to private organizations including associations, professional societies, research institutes, foundations and corporations. Table 1.3 details submissions by funding source, as well as total funds requested of both public and private agencies. The existing data are of interest in that they emphasize that faculty are diversifying the type of agency from which they seek support. The smaller dollar value of funds requested from private sources is perhaps indicative that private funding is sought for short-term, selective program needs that inject significant resources into the University for limited periods of time, whereas public funding tends to be sought for initiatives requiring long-term, larger scale financial commitments.

A full listing of the public and private agencies from which DePaul sought funding for sponsored projects in FY 2023 is detailed in the Submissions by Source of Support section that follows. Submissions to three agencies, the National Institutes of Health, the National Science Foundation and the U.S. Department of Education account for 76.3% of all DePaul funds requested and 91.1% of federal dollars requested. Interestingly, in FY 2023, like FY 2022 and 2021, funds solicited from the National Institutes of Health, totaling \$23.4M exceeded those requested of the National Science Foundation, \$16.8M; reversing earlier year's performance in which NSF dollars exceeded those requested of all other funding agencies.

SUBMISSIONS BY UNIT

Table 1.4 details FY2023 submission data by academic unit. While all colleges and many administrative units had submissions in FY 2023, submission activity was concentrated in two colleges, the Jarvis College of Computing and Digital Media (CDM) and the College of Science and Health (CSH), which collectively account for 66.6% of DePaul's 2023 submissions, and 76.5% of the funds solicited by the University this fiscal year.

Notably, the number of CDM submissions increased 80% between FY2022 and FY2023, while the amount of funds solicited diminished 3.36% between the two fiscal years. Over the decade, the number of CDM submissions increased 248% while the amount of funds solicited rose 74%.

FY2023 CSH submissions increased 26% over FY2022 levels, while the number of submissions over the decade increased 76%. By comparison, the level of CSH solicited funds increased 70.4%

between FY2022 and FY2023 but diminished 24% over the decade.

The increase in submission levels between FY 2022 and FY 2023 for both of the aforementioned academic units was predominated by data, material transfer and nondisclosure submissions that did not request funds in support of University sponsored activity though did contribute to the research and creative activities of the faculty over the reporting period.

Though most other colleges and schools had slight decreases in the number of submissions in FY 2023, a notable exception is the College of Law, whose submissions increased 37.5% in FY2023 over FY 2022 levels. As expected with a decrease in the number of submissions, the dollar value of total submissions decreased across several academic units in FY2023 as compared to FY2022; an increase in the dollar value of submissions was however recorded for the College of Law and the School for Continuing and Professional Studies.

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Technical Note: Entries with a zero-dollar value are submissions that did not request funds from a sponsor. These may be submissions in which DePaul is providing cost share only, or submissions related to Data Requests, Materials Transfer, Facilities Use, Nondisclosure, etc. Noteworthy also, the Number column is a submission count; multiple submissions may be transmitted to an agency to secure funding for a proposal. Similarly, the Amount column reflects the dollar value of the total submissions to each listed agency.

SECTION II: EXTRAMURAL AWARDS

The Extramural Awards section of the report summarizes the activities of the Award Management unit of ORS. This unit assists faculty and staff with the management of grants, contracts, cooperative agreements and other award mechanisms through a variety of activities that begin when a notice of grant award is issued and extend until the award is closed-out. ORS is assisted in this function by the Restricted Accounting Office; management of corporate and foundation sponsored project awards is done in concert with DePaul's Advancement Office. The number of awards and the level of funding associated with those awards are the metrics used to understand this unit's level of activity. Therefore, these two metrics are incorporated into the various tables that are used to report on Award Management activities in Section II. The *Annual Report* also highlights new awards the University received in FY 2023 that equal or exceed \$100K in funding and includes individual listings of awards received in FY 2023 by project lead.

FEATURED AWARDS

Many faculty at DePaul balance their responsibilities in the classroom educating and mentoring students with competing for and securing external funding in support of their research, scholarship, and service activities. The project will provide systems of support to address the challenges inherent in preparing all students and teachers for success in AP CSP and ensure that the course is taught using culturally responsive pedagogy.

Level 5 Credential and 3,500 students (50% of whom will be newly enrolled) will enroll in or complete associate degrees in early childhood and/or certificates leading to a Gateways credentials at Consortium member institutions.

The goal of the project is to understand sexual assault survivors' experiences seeking civil no contact orders (CNCOs) and their experiences working with advocates and lawyers while seeking CNCOs. We will conduct qualitative interviews with 45-50 survivors (specifically 15-20 rural survivors and 30-35 from Chicago, at least 10 of whom will be Latinx and 10 of whom will be Black; at least 15 will have met with lawyers and 15 will not).

Title: *PCB-induced priming of microglial activity across sexes and development*

The overall objective of this proposal is to identify direct effects and putative mechanisms of PCB action on microglial function and possible neuronal consequences. The central hypothesis is that PCBs will prime microglia to produce exaggerated responses to a secondary challenge in age- and sex-specific ways. The application proposes to use microglia acutely isolated from male and female neonatal and adolescent whole brains and treated to individual PCB congeners, an environmentally representative mixture, or vehicle in vitro prior to a control or immune challenge.

This project aims to train counseling interns and practicum students and support their delivery of Act & Adapt, an evidence-based group coping skills

intervention that was developed and tailored for ethnic minority early adolescents. The intervention has been evaluated and found to be efficacious among CPS students and has been widely disseminated to 120 CPS schools. Using a scaling up strategy, we anticipate supporting the training of 96 school-based counseling trainees over the next five years with an expectation that they will be employed by CPS or another high-need education agency and be well equipped to serve students of diverse backgrounds.

DePaul's Urban Collaborative (UC) offers timely, community-based, interdisciplinary research and projects that address critical partner needs while providing students with hands-on learning. Community Project-Based Learning Internship Scholarships and the Student Urban Research Corps offer real-world experiences to build essential skills to make students more marketable graduates; financial support allows students to pursue meaningful projects otherwise off-limits due to limited resources. Urban Community- Based Research Initiative accelerator funding allows teams of faculty, student, and external partners to pursue cutting-edge research.

Title: *MCA: New approaches to studying mast-seeding dynamics*

Award: National Science Foundation; 10/1/2022-9/30/2025; \$331,912

Understanding the patterns and drivers of plant reproduction is a long-standing challenge in ecology. The number of seeds produced by perennial plants over time shows incredible variation across species and locations, from consistent levels of annual reproduction to boom and bust years of seed production exhibiting extremely high temporal variability, known as "mast seeding". The purpose of this project is to bring together the aboveground phenomenon of mast seeding, with belowground traits and belowground species interactions using multiple global databases and long-term field data. This study has the potential to reveal new drivers of annual fluctuations in reproduction in natural and managed forestry systems. In addition to exploring the impact of mycorrhizae on reproductive dynamics, this project may inform forestry practices.

Title: *Impacts of Rapid Habitat Change: Mammalian diversity and its response to deforestation in a global biodiversity hotspot*

Habitat loss and fragmentation are primary threats to biodiversity conservation and can lead to stress, immunosuppression, and disease in wildlife, thereby directly impacting populations. Additionally, these landscape changes increase zoonotic host diversity and have been linked to incidence and emergence of zoonotic and vector-borne diseases. This interdisciplinary, mechanistic research project simultaneously combines parasitology and other pathogens, stress hormone physiology, population genetics, biodiversity and landscape ecology to answer the question: How does forest fragmentation impact the health of small mammals living in a distinct and understudied system, the Interior Atlantic Forest in Paraguay?

AWARD TRENDS

In FY 2023, DePaul University received 236 new and continuation awards (138 with monetary activity). Revenue from external funding agencies totaled \$16,774,373 in fiscal year 2023. This revenue total includes \$10,438,964 in new award dollars and \$6,335,409 in FY 2023 continuation funding. Continuation funding occurs when a funding agency makes an award commitment to the institution, but transfers the award dollars to the institution, incrementally, typically in annual installments based on satisfactory technical progress on a project. Continuation dollars are counted by DePaul as award volume in the year in which the funds are actually received, rather than at time of initial award notice projecting future receipt of such funds. In comparison to FY 2022, the number of new and continuation awards received in FY 2023 increased 55.3% from 152 to 236 while overall award revenue increased an estimated 56.7% from \$10,707,434 to \$16,774,373. The dollar value of new awards received in FY 2023 increased 26.3% over FY2022 levels. It is important to note that not all awards generate revenue, some are for nondisclosure, material transfer, and data exchanges that contribute to the research and creative activities of the faculty without funding.

AWARDS BY PURPOSE

While extramural awards received by DePaul in FY 2023 cover a broad spectrum of activities, as detailed in Table 2.1, research-related activities account for the preponderance of this year's support. An estimated 92% of the 236 awards received by DePaul University in FY 2023 were in support of research.

Similarly, 85% of the \$16.8M in funds awarded to the University in FY 2023 supported research activities. Institutional support accounted for \$1.2M, or 7%, of funds received in FY 2023, while Academic Program support accounted for 4.1% of dollars, or \$692,752.

PUBLIC vs. PRIVATE AWARDS

DePaul University, like other academic institutions, relies on funding from a variety of sources, including, the federal government, state, municipal agencies, as well as private sources of support such as associations,

funding, or \$13,239,000; while private sources accounted for 21%, or \$3,535,373, of funds received. The federal government has consistently been the single largest contributor to funding at DePaul, providing an estimated 67% of the \$16.8 M in support received in FY 2023, and 85% or \$11.28M of the awarded public share (Table 2.3).

AWARDS BY UNIT

As indicated in Table 2.4, seven of DePaul's ten Colleges received sponsored project funding in FY 2023, as did several University administrative units. The College of Science and Health (CSH) is the most prominent DePaul recipient of sponsored project funding in FY 2023. The dollar share of CSH's FY 2023 award volume totaled \$7,051,728, or 42.0% of the University's total award volume of \$16,774,373, up

from a 35.2% share in FY 2022. The College of Computing and Digital Media (20.4%) and the College of Education (16.0%) also contributed substantively to the University's award revenue in FY 2023. By comparison, in FY 2023, the College of Liberal Arts and Social Sciences (7.65%), the College of Business (3.11%), the College of Law (3.80%) and the College of Communication (0.05%) each contributed lesser shares of award revenue.

SECTION III: INTRAMURAL SUBMISSIONS AND AWARDS

ORS administers intramural grants awarded by the University Research Council (URC), Quality of Instruction Council (QIC), Public Service Council (PSC) and Academic Growth and Innovation Fund (AGIF). These grant programs are used to support the research, teaching, and service activities of faculty members across the University. Similar to Sections I and II, the number of proposals/ awards and the level of funding associated with them are used as the metrics in Section III.

SUMMARY

Intramural research funding is designed to support the individual scholar with an innovative idea in a traditionally underfunded area of research, or the scholar who needs monetary assistance in bringing a preliminary scholarly, instructional, or creative activity to fruition. DePaul University’s Office of Research Services

confers intramural awards through the three Councils: URC, QIC, and PSC. Proposals submitted to the Councils are peer reviewed and recommended for award by the vote of Council Members. In FY 2023, the Councils conferred 72 intramural awards totaling \$356,100.

Additional intramural funding is made available to DePaul academic units through the Academic Growth and Innovation Fund (AGIF), and the Undergraduate Research Assistant Program (URAP). AGIF grants support innovative ideas that will generate institutional revenue; URAP funds are provided as block grants to academic units in support of undergraduate research assistance.

The FY 2023 distribution of funds by the Councils, AGIF and URAP are detailed in the following subsections.

University Research Council The URC supports the faculty's research, scholarship and creative activities through competitive grants and leaves. In addition to helping faculty maintain their intellectual vitality, the grants and leaves are intended as a stepping-stone for securing external funding. The URC received 59 proposals totaling \$293,126 in FY 2023; the Council conferred 50 awards totaling \$243,128. 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COUNCIL SUPPORT

Table 3.1, FY 2023 Requests/Awards by Council, details the total number of proposal submissions to the three Councils along with the total dollar value of funds requested. The number of awards conferred by each Council in FY 2023, and the aggregate dollars awarded are also detailed in Table 3.1. Similar to extramural funding, most Council intramural funding, an estimated 68.3% of funds awarded in FY 2023, were for research projects supported by the URC.

Table 3.2, Total Intramural Council Funds Awarded, FY 2017-2023, details the aggregate number and dollar value of Council awards for the FY 2017 to FY 2023 period. Both the quantity and amount of intramural grants funded has fluctuated during this timeframe. The number of Council awards in FY 2023 decreased 41.3% since its record high in FY 2018. Similarly, funds awarded by the Council in the FY 2018 to FY 2023 period also decreased 45.7%, from \$660,462 in FY 2018 to \$356,100 in FY 2023.

More recently, between FY 2022 and FY 2023 funding awarded through the Councils contracted 7% from \$358,612 in FY 2022 to \$356,100 in FY 2023. Despite this decrease, all submissions recommended for funding by the Councils in FY 2023 were supported.

Faculty from nine of DePaul's ten colleges applied for intramural Council funding and were recipients of intramural awards in FY 2023. College of Science and Health (CSH) faculty submitted 29.8% of all proposals and received 33.3% of FY 2023 awards (Table 3.3). The College of Liberal Arts and Social Sciences (LAS) and the College of Computing and Digital Media (CDM) followed with an estimated 21.4% and 14.3% of proposals and 20.8% and 15.3% of FY2023 awards, respectively. Other units were each responsible for a lesser volume of proposals submitted to the Councils; as expected given submission levels, each unit received fewer Council conferred awards.

AGIF SUPPORT

The Academic Growth and Innovation Fund supports innovative academic ideas that will positively impact DePaul University's revenue within the next three years. The term "idea", in reference to this Fund, was broadly conceived at time of program inception, to allow applicants maximum latitude in program conception and

stage of project implementation. In FY 2023, the Fund directly supported three new projects with awards totaling \$546,655. Table 3.4 details AGIF funding by Unit in FY 2023. Noteworthy, some AGIF initiatives receive multi-year support and/or institutional support from sources beyond this Fund that are not recorded in this table.

URAP SUPPORT

The University's Undergraduate Research Assistant Program (URAP), which offers students a unique opportunity to work with a faculty member, or group of faculty, on the planning and implementation of a research project through block grants to DePaul academic units continued in FY 2023, with the program providing a total of 146 units of student support. Nine of the University's ten colleges participated in the URAP program in FY 2023. The URAP program enhances participating students' overall academic experience at DePaul, by providing them with opportunities to collaborate with faculty members

who conduct research, or other scholarly/creative activities, in disciplinary areas of their choosing. Similarly, it provides our faculty with the benefits of compensated research assistance in support of their scholarly endeavors. URAP program experience can prove to be an important asset to students embarking on careers that demand research experience and/ or project management skills, or supply an important breadth of knowledge to those who chose to pursue graduate or professional studies. The distribution of FY 2023 URAP units and associated funding, by academic unit, is detailed below in Table 3.5.

SECTION IV: RESEARCH PROTECTIONS

The Research Protections section summarizes the activities of the Research Protections area of ORS. The activities of the Research Protections unit are best measured by understanding the number of protocols that are submitted to the committees overseen by this unit, therefore, the metric of submissions is used to report on Research Protections activities throughout Section IV.

SUMMARY

The Research Protections unit of the Office of Research Services at DePaul University consolidates several ancillary services that directly impact the conduct of research at the University. ORS' Protections unit services include the administration of three federally mandated review committees: the Institutional Review Board, the Institutional Biosafety Committee, and the Institutional Animal Care and Use Committee. In collaboration with these committees, ORS monitors compliance with protections-related federal, state, and local regulatory requirements. In FY 2023, the Committees reviewed, in aggregate, 735 submissions; this figure includes 216 revisions to initial IRB submissions and amendments that were not recorded in prior fiscal years in this report.

At FY 2023 close, the three Committees were actively managing a total of 804 protocols, as compared to the 887 managed at FY 2022 close.

INSTITUTIONAL REVIEW BOARD

DePaul's Institutional Review Board (IRB) is a university-wide committee charged with overseeing research activities involving human subjects conducted by the DePaul community. The IRB is comprised of faculty and staff from various academic and administrative units, as well as local community representatives.

IRB submissions by Type are summarized in Table 4.1. New Projects increased 0.5% in FY 2023 over FY 2022 levels, while protocol amendments reviewed by the IRB increased 7.3% and IRB continuing reviews decreased by 39.1%. The decrease in continuing reviews was anticipated, given federal human subject regulations no longer require annual review of most expedited protocols. There has been a 62% decrease in reliance agreements with other institutions with a federal-wide assurance. As noted above, the number of revisions requested after initial review was captured for the first time in FY 2023; this value comprises an estimated 34% of IRB submissions.

This fiscal year, the Research Protections unit offered the University community workshops on requirements for submission to the IRB using the eProtocol system. The Protections' unit also worked to close older protocols and transition older protocols that could not be closed to new federal regulations, in this year's reporting period.

INSTITUTIONAL BIOSAFETY COMMITTEE

The Institutional Biosafety Committee (IBC) oversees the use of biohazardous materials in research and teaching. The IBC is a federally mandated oversight committee that ensures the safe acquisition, use, and disposal of all biohazardous agents at the university. IBC Submissions by Type are categorized in Table 4.2. Full Committee reviews increased from 11 in FY 2022 to 14 this fiscal year; Designated Member Reviews by the IBC increased from 20 reviews in FY 2022 to 27 reviews this FY. In FY 2023 the Unit also completed the IBC eProtocol User Guide to facilitate researcher navigation of the online IBC submission system.

INSTITUTIONAL ANIMAL CARE AND USE COMMITTEE

The Institutional Animal Care and Use Committee (IACUC) oversees the use of animals in research and teaching activities. The IACUC is a federally mandated oversight committee that reviews all proposals for the use of live vertebrate animals consistent with the National Institutes of Health Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare. IACUC Submissions are detailed in Table 4.3. IACUC Designated Member Reviews of protocols increased 20% in FY 2022, rising from 5 in FY 2021 to 6 this fiscal year. Full Committee Review of IACUC protocols decreased 47.6%, declining from 21 in FY 2021 to 11 in FY 2022. Noteworthy however, this decline in activity is an artifact of the artificially high number of Full Committee Reviews conducted in FY 2021. Implementation of the IACUC eProtocol system in FY 2021 necessitated a one-time full committee review of all active IACUC protocols following system launch.

This past fall and spring, the IACUC's Research Support Facility also submitted Health Surveillance Materials to the Charles River Laboratory as part of its commitment to DePaul's Occupational Health & Safety Plan.

RESEARCH PROTECTIONS SUBMISSIONS BY UNIT

As might be expected, the focus of the activity of the three oversight committees is the College of Science and Health (CSH). In FY 2023, approximately 60% of research protections submissions, and all IBC and IACUC submissions, originated with faculty, staff, and students in CSH (Table 4.4). Modest groupings of IRB activity were also concentrated in the Colleges

of Business, Communication, Computing and Digital Media, Education and Liberal Arts and Social Sciences. The College of Law, the School of Continuing and Professional Studies as well as various Administrative Units contributed negligibly to research protections submission levels this FY. The School of Music and The Theatre School, did not record any research protections activities in FY 2023 nor did they have any such activities in FY 2022.
