

## Uniform Guidance Implementation by Agency

### NIH and NSF

Agency	Implementation Steps
<b>National Institutes of Health (NIH)</b>	<p>The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS), which includes NIH, has published an agency-specific version of the Uniform Guidance in the Code of Federal Regulations (<a href="#">45 CFR Part 75</a>) that applies to NIH grant awards issued on or after 12/26/2014 which obligate new or supplemental funds.</p> <p>In March of 2015, NIH published a revised <a href="#">Grants Policy Statement</a> that incorporates the new HHS regulations referred to above.</p> <p>NIH has also published a set of <a href="#">Interim Grant General Conditions</a>, dated 12/26/14, which it incorporates into new grant awards by reference. The interim conditions will be used until revised Research Terms and Conditions become effective.</p> <p>See also NIH's <a href="#">FAQs</a> concerning the Uniform Guidance and the NIH Interim Grant Conditions.</p>
<b>National Science Foundation (NSF)</b>	<p>NSF has implemented the Uniform Guidance through its publication of a new Proposal and Award Policies and Procedures Guide (<a href="#">PAPPG</a>), dated 12/26/2014. The first three pages of the Guide highlight changes made in this edition, many of them to comply with the Uniform Guidance.</p> <p>NSF has published <a href="#">Grant General Conditions (GC-1)</a>, dated 12/26/2014, that apply to new awards and funding amendments to existing awards issued on or after that date. These Grant Conditions are in effect on an interim basis, until revised Research Terms and Conditions become available.</p> <p>See also NSF's <a href="#">FAQs</a> on the implementation of the Uniform Guidance.</p>

## Other Federal Agencies

Agency	Implementation Steps
<b>Department of Education (ED)</b>	<p>ED has published a helpful Uniform Guidance <a href="#">resource page</a> on its web site for its grantees.</p> <p>For grant awards made after 12/26/2014, the Uniform Guidance replaces Parts 74 and 80 of the Education Department General Administrative Regulations (EDGAR), which previously provided the administrative requirements for ED’s grant awards. Part 74 applied to institutions of higher education.</p> <p>See also ED’s <a href="#">FAQs</a> on the implementation of the Uniform Guidance.</p>
<b>Department of State (DOS)</b>	<p>DOS references the Uniform Guidance in its <a href="#">Proposal Submission Instructions (PSI)</a>, dated October 2014, indicating that the Guidance will apply to all awards made on or after 12/26/2014.</p>
<b>Environmental Protection Agency (EPA)</b>	<p>EPA has published an agency-specific version of the Uniform Guidance in the Code of Federal Regulations (<a href="#">2 CFR 1500</a>).</p>
<b>National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA)</b>	<p>NASA has published an agency-specific version of the Uniform Guidance in the Code of Federal Regulations (<a href="#">2 CFR 1800</a>).</p>
<b>National Endowment for the Arts (NEA)</b>	<p>NEA has adopted the Uniform Guidance in its entirety through regulation at <a href="#">2 CFR 3255.1</a>.</p> <p>NEA’s <a href="#">General Terms and Conditions for FY 2015 Grants</a>, dated January 2015, provides a more detailed implementation of the Uniform Guidance.</p>
<b>National Endowment for the Humanities (NEH)</b>	<p>NEH has not yet updated its grant terms and conditions or published regulations aimed at implementing the Uniform Guidance. However, the Uniform Guidance still applies to NEH grants awarded after 12/26/2014.</p>
