
Establishing a plan for communication with your student can help to alleviate homesickness. If your student is struggling to adjust to college life, you can refer them to University Counseling Services.

Above: *St. Vincent de Paul Church, located at the corner of Webster and Sheffield avenues, was dedicated on May 1, 1897. It is connected to the St. Vincent de Paul Parish and is an architectural gem of the university.*

Below: *These bronze lion statues are located at the west entrance of the Art Institute of Chicago on Michigan Avenue. Created by Edward L. Kemeys, they were a gift from Mrs. Henry Field for the Art Institute's opening at its current location in 1893. KEEP IN MIND...

Above: Just a short walk or an “L” stop away from the DePaul Lincoln Park Campus, the historic Armitage street area is home to many great restaurants and shops. Students are often seen around this area exploring many of the shops and boutiques.

KEEP IN MIND...

Academic pressures may emerge as pre-finals stress sets in for your student. Encourage them to reach out to professors and advisors for support and assistance.

Your student is preparing to return home for winter break—this is a good time to discuss expectations of one another during the break.

The FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) has been open for a month, so now is a good time to complete this process. Because many sources of funds are limited, or are subject to deadlines, it is important to file your student’s FAFSA for the coming academic year as early as possible after October 1.

Above: The Commons building was built in 1929 for the McCormick Theological Seminary and was used as its dining hall. In 1976, when the seminary left Lincoln Park, DePaul University purchased the Commons. In 1993 DePaul renamed the building Cortelyou Commons after Rev. John R. Cortelyou, C.M., DePaul's eighth president (1964-81). The building is now used for a wide variety of events, including weddings, meetings and lectures.

Below: The Harold Washington Library-State/Van Buren "L" stop opened in 1997 and is located on the south end of Chicago's downtown loop. This stop serves the DePaul Loop Campus and the Harold Washington Library, which is the central library of Chicago Public Library system.

Above: Go Cubs go! Located just two "L" stops north of the Lincoln Park Campus, Wrigley Field is home of the Chicago Cubs, a team popular with many in the DePaul community.

Below: More widely known as "The Bean," this popular Chicago landmark and photo spot is actually named Cloud Gate. It is located in Millennium Park in downtown Chicago and is a public sculpture created by British artist Anish Kapoor. Cloud Gate is 66 feet long, 33 feet high and weighs over 110 tons. Its mirror-like appearance offers great reflections of the Chicago skyline. It is a signature landmark in Chicago.

Our cross-trained staff is readily available to assist students and families take care of their concerns and make well-informed decisions regarding financial aid inquires, personal financial planning, immunizations, records and transcripts, and account transactions.

DePaul Central provides in-person, email, phone, web and chat services to help students and families understand how to take care of their business and make well-informed decisions. The offices described below are all part of DePaul Central:

Financial Aid

Our financial aid experts in DePaul Central can help you and your student learn about financial aid opportunities and complete the necessary steps to process your student's financial aid. Students have access to view and manage their financial aid award online through Campus Connect.

Financial Fitness at DePaul Central

DePaul's Financial Fitness Program provides free services, resources and tools to help students manage costs from freshman year through graduation and beyond.

Student Accounts

DePaul provides simple ways for your student to view tuition bills, enroll in a payment plan and make a payment through Campus Connect. Tuition payments can be made online, in-person or by mail. Be sure to include your student's DePaul ID number when making payments.

University Registrar

The University Registrar supports the core principles of the university and ensures the accuracy and privacy of each student's academic record in order to protect the value and integrity of a DePaul education.

Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 (FERPA)

DePaul is committed to maintaining student records privacy, in compliance with the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 (FERPA). Students are responsible for setting and maintaining their FERPA directory release preferences in Campus Connect.

Students are encouraged to communicate directly with their parents and/or family members regarding academic progress and other important issues. Students have access to view and print such information as their schedule, grades, financial aid award, and account balances and payments through Campus Connect.

Delegating Access to Information

Students can go to the "Share My Information" page within Campus Connect that would then begin the process of delegating access to specific information and how the proxies can access specific information. At this time, students are able to allow view-only access to the following screens in Campus Connect: Class Schedule, Contact Information, Course History, Emergency Contacts, Holds, To Do List, and Financial Aid.
