







About the Program

The McNair Scholars Program is designed to help undergraduates build knowledge and skills, improve educational planning and decision-making, and expand participants' horizons to enable them to be competitive candidates for graduate study with the goal of completing **doctoral degrees**.

The program utilizes a specialized curriculum and activities including seminars, coursework, and faculty-supervised research to foster the commitment needed to pursue doctoral studies and a career of university-level teaching and research.

Who Should Apply?

Rising Juniors and Seniors who

- Qualify as either:
 - First-generation college student whose household meets the <u>low-income</u> guidelines established by the U.S. Department of Education;

OR

- Be a member of a group that is underrepresented in graduate education (currently defined by the U.S. Department of Education as Native American/Alaska Native, Black/African-American, Hispanic/Latino, Native Hawa
- Native, Black/African-American, Hispanic/Latino, Native Hawaiian or other Pacific Islander)
- ♦ Have a sincere and compelling desire to complete a PhD
- ♦ Be a citizen or permanent legal resident of the United States
- Possess a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or above
- ♦ Maintain continuous enrollment as a degree-seeking <u>undergraduate student</u> in good standing

- Participate in a paid summer research internship
- Work with a faculty member in their chosen field
- Present research at a national conference
- Learn about graduate study in their chosen field
- Receive graduate school application assistance and advocacy, including funding
- Participate in free GRE test preparation courses
