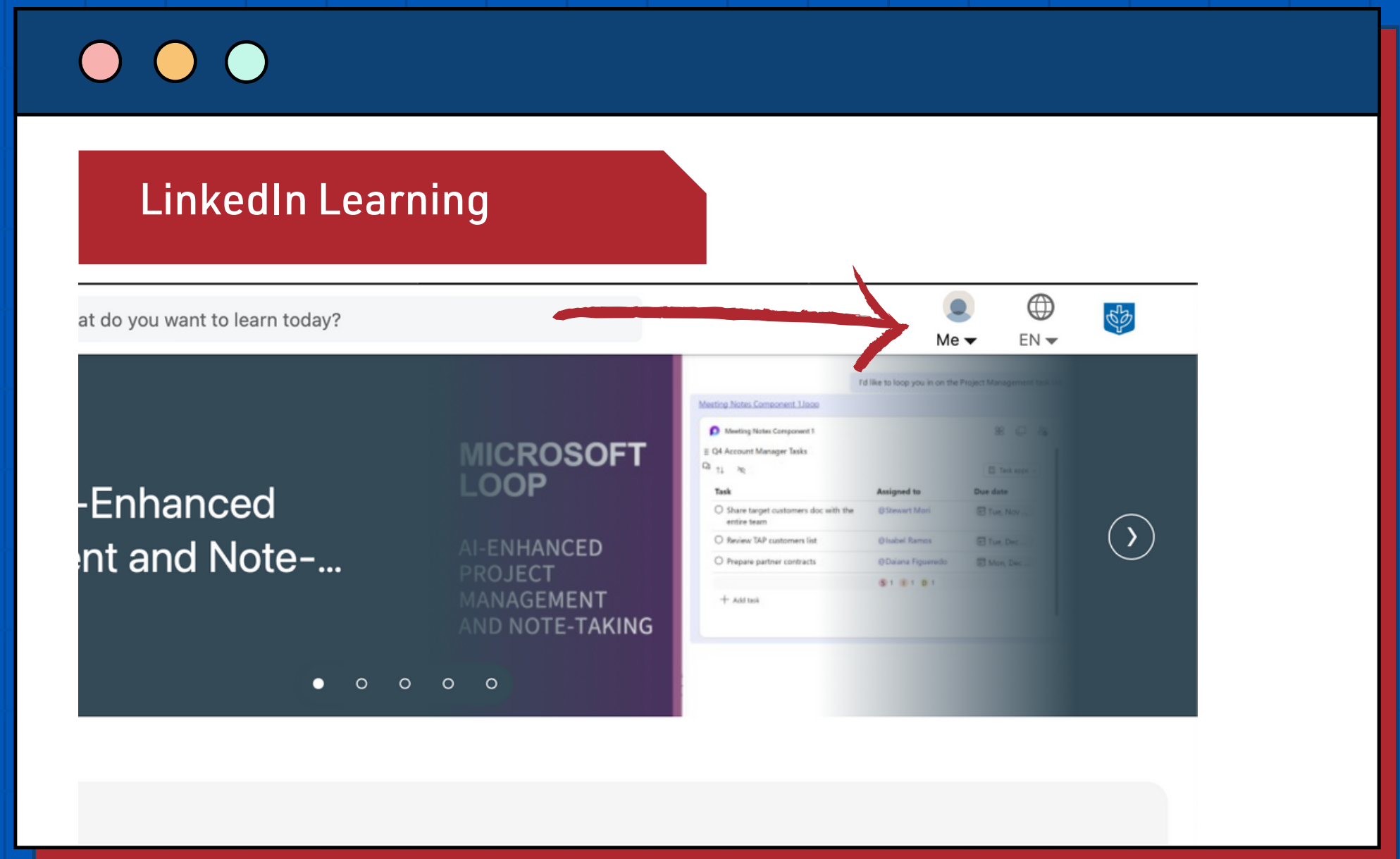


Finding LinkedIn Learning

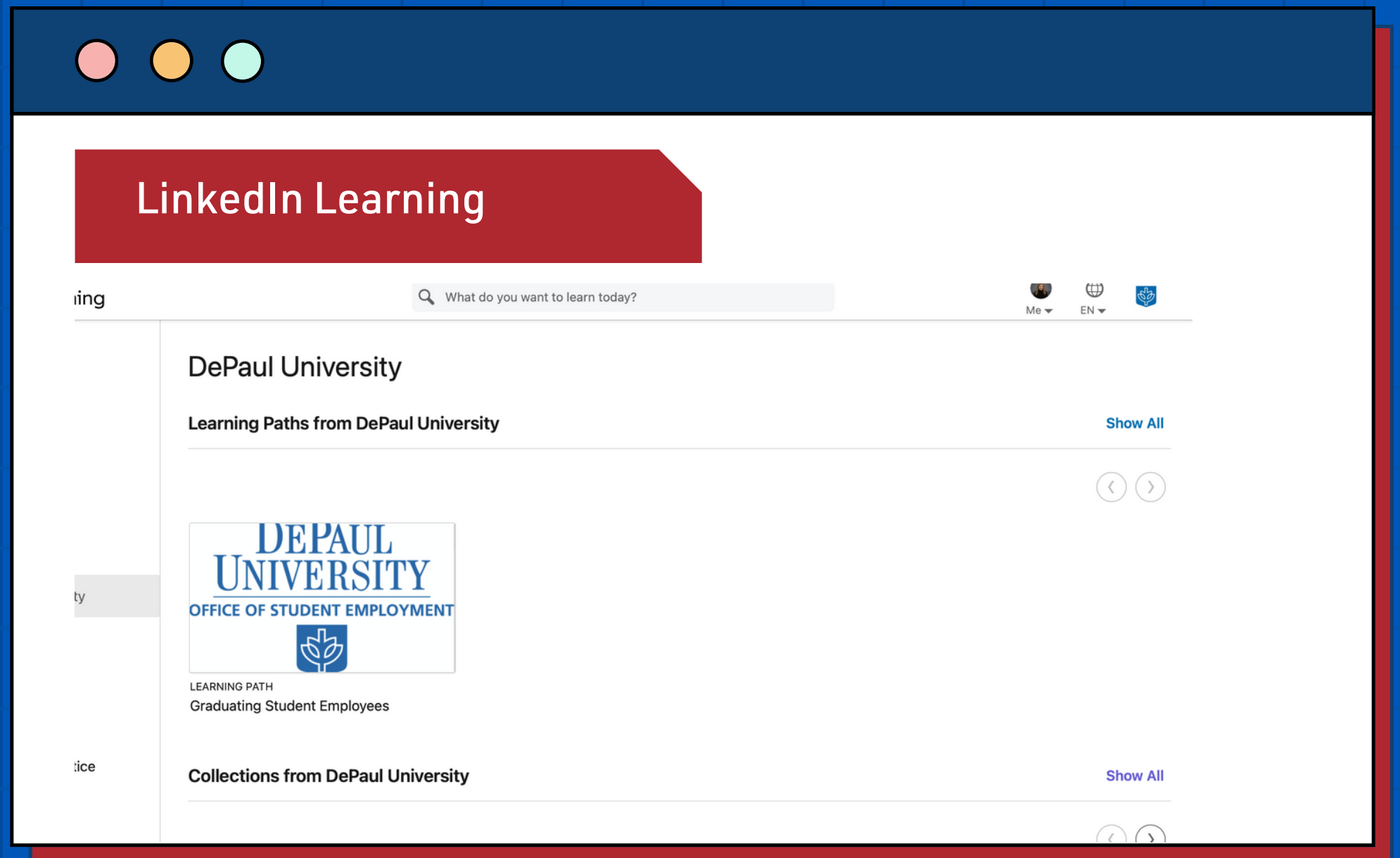
When on the homepage, click the "DePaul University" option in the left side navigation bar.


The first option you will see is the "Learning Paths" which offers trainings and resources for graduating student employees.
