
Logging In

If you do not wish to connect this to your personal LinkedIn account you can skip ahead in this guide to find instructions on how to access the DePaul University LinkedIn Learning content!

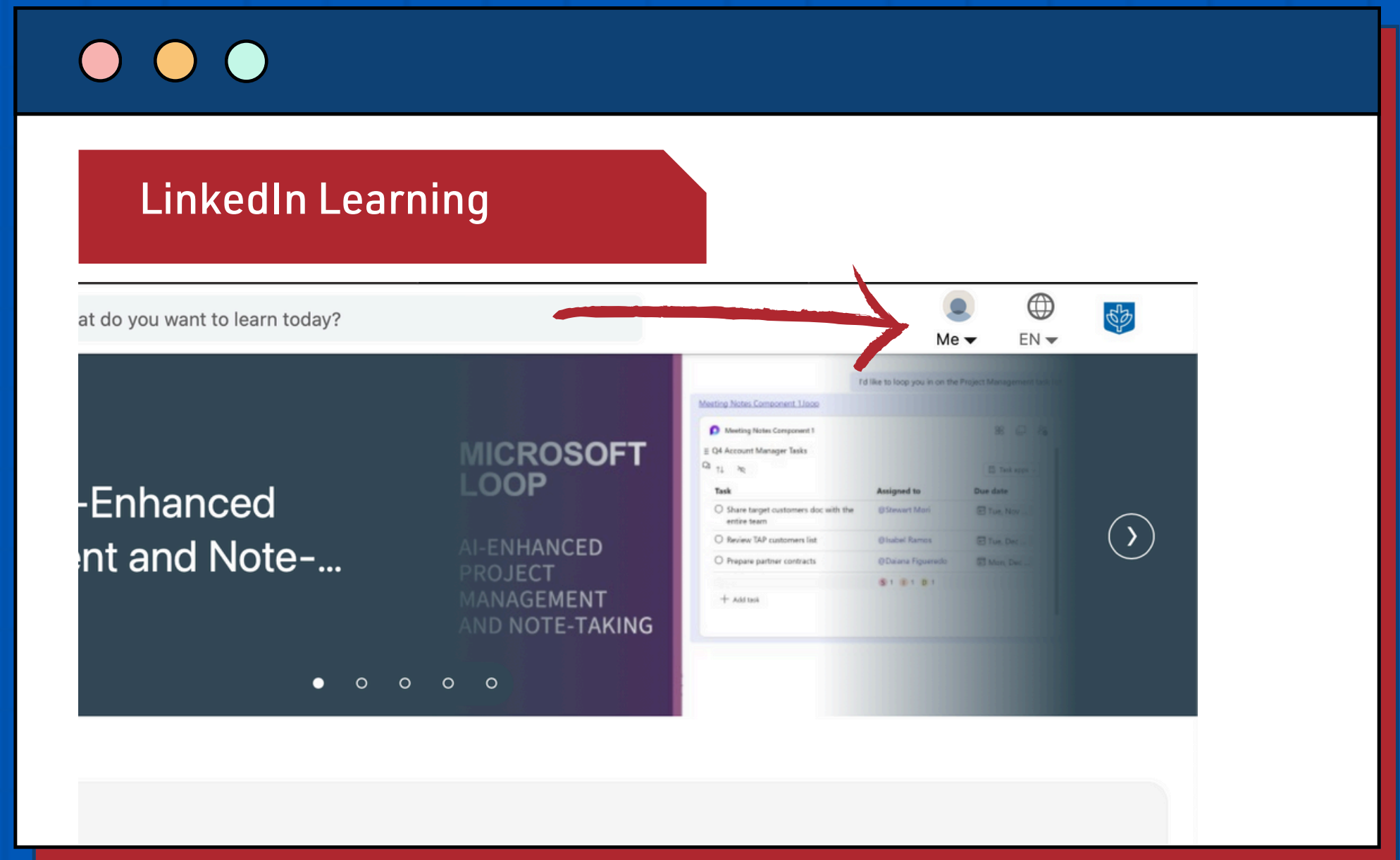

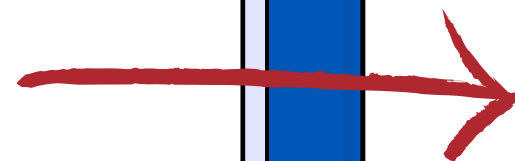

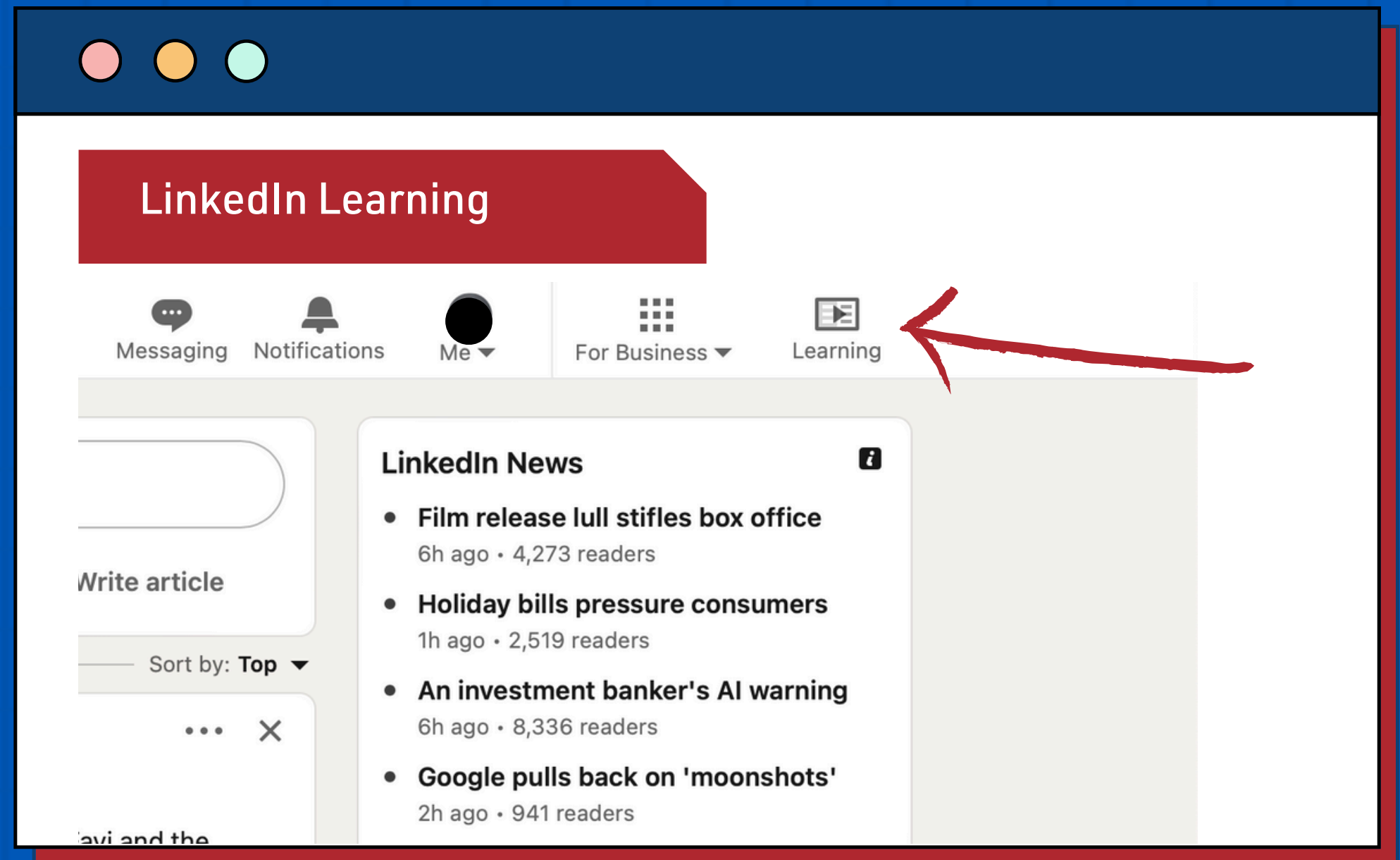

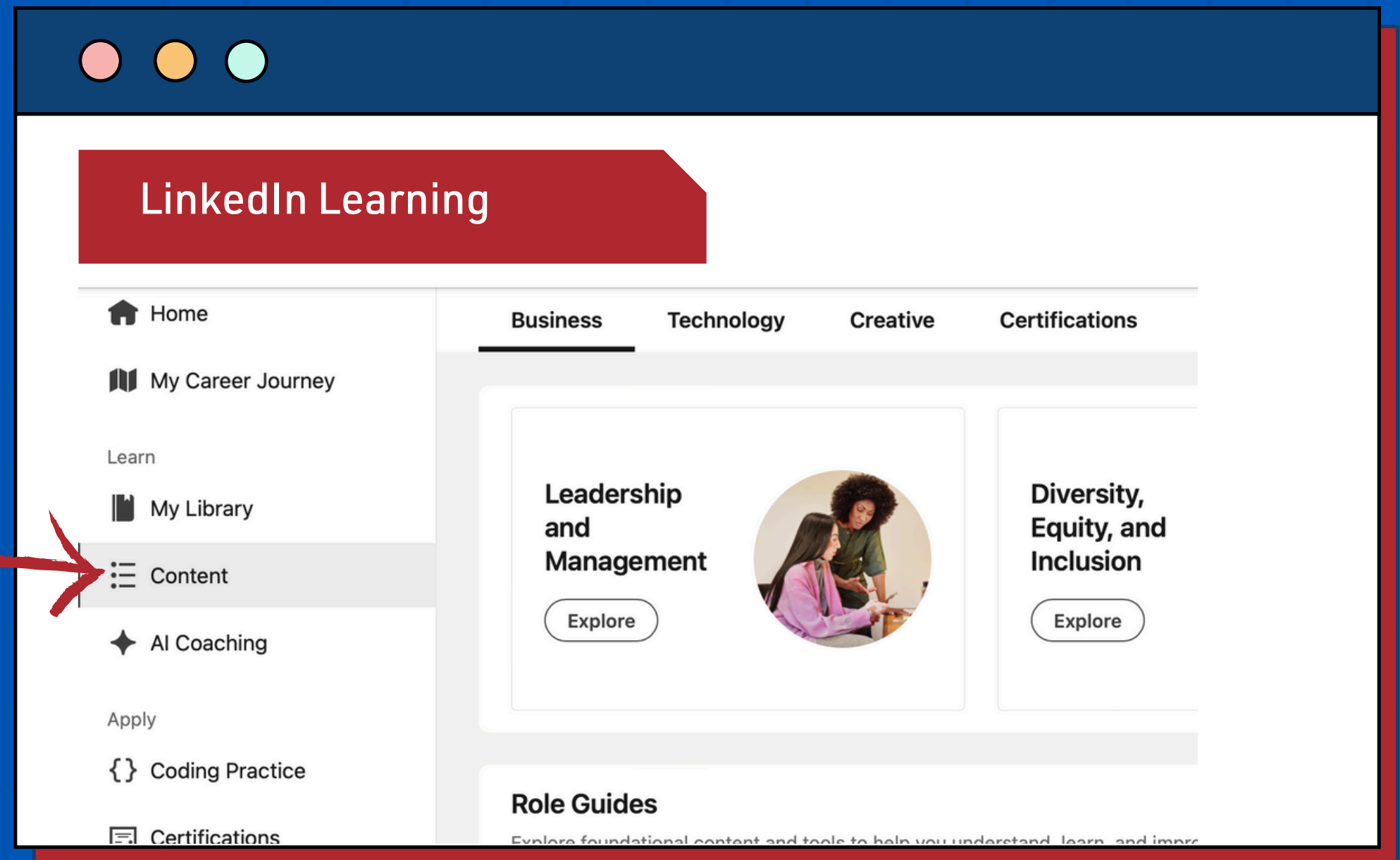
Finding LinkedIn Learning

If you are trying to find LinkedIn Learning from the LinkedIn homepage, just click the "Learning" box in the upper right hand corner.



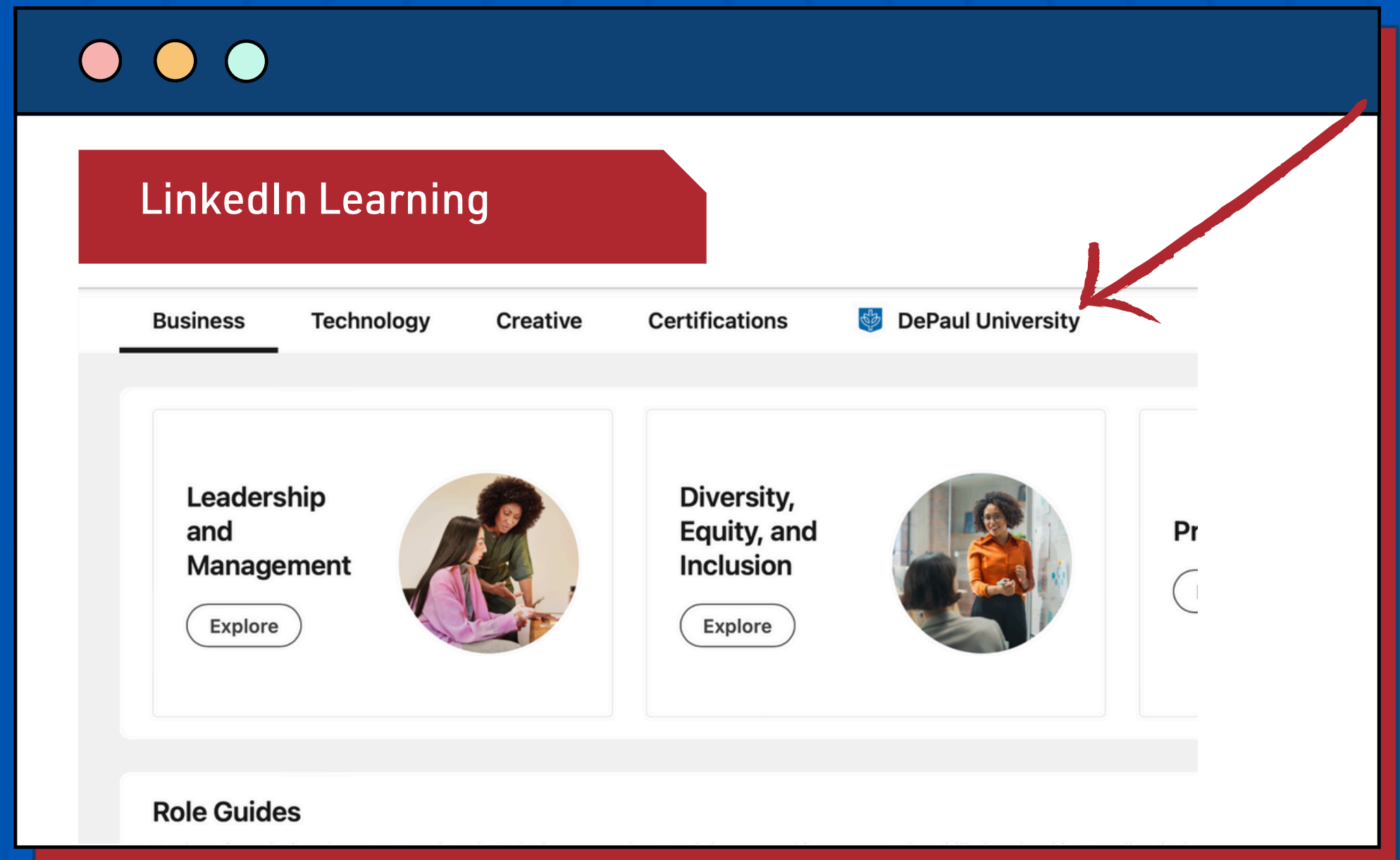
Searching For Content

When on the homepage, click the "Content" tab on the menu on the left.



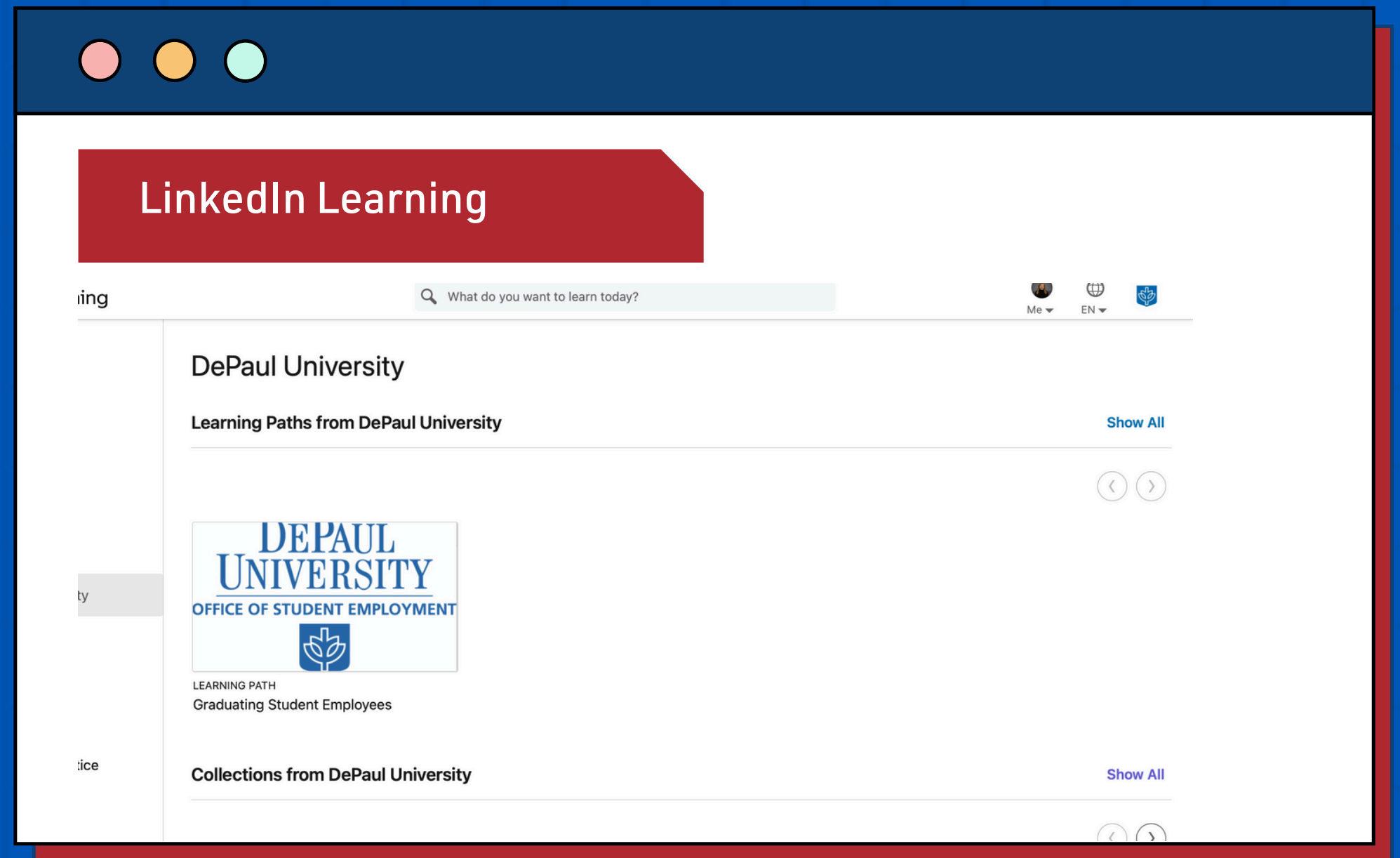
Searching For Content

Searching For Content

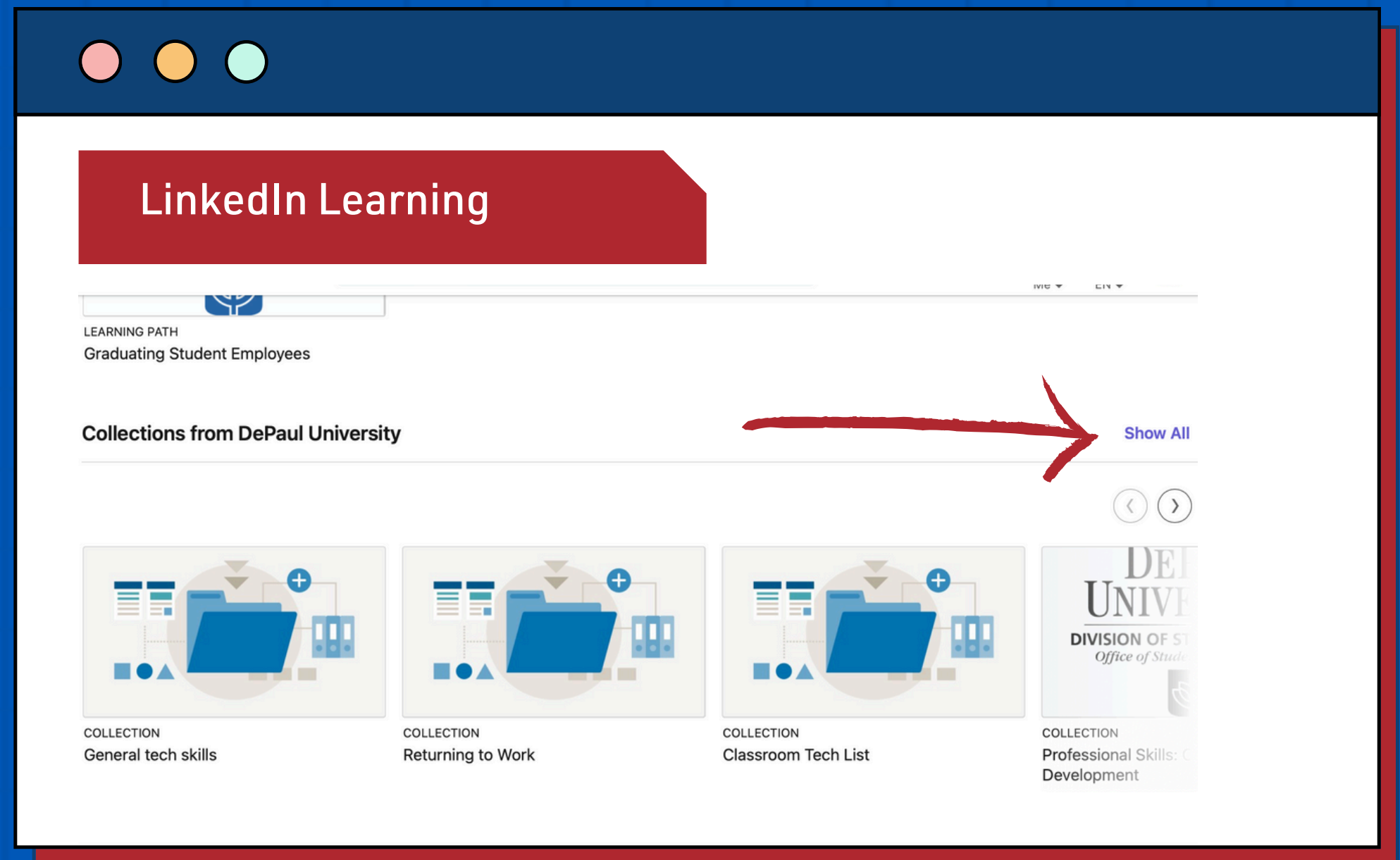
The first option you will see is the “Learning Paths” which offers trainings and resources for graduating student employees.
